

Virtual Workshop: Beading into Embroidery, with Jennifer Lamontagne

Attendees will also have a 30-minute, one-on-one session with Jen in between the sessions

Class Description:

Learn to sculpt unique beads from polymer clay to incorporate in your embroidery and textile art. In this workshop, participants will learn how to attach seed beads, bugle beads, and sequins to create texture and form on the surface of your artwork. Start a new piece or bring a current "work in progress" to incorporate your beads.

This course is for participants who have some prior knowledge of embroidery. However, anyone that also registered for Beginner Embroidery with Jennifer LaMontagne could also register for this workshop.
